Mapping of Priority Actions across key national and local policies:

NATIONAL

Population Health Framework – 17th June 25

Focus on prevention as main initial priority and reducing inequalities embedded throughout. Key links within initial action sections. Prevention focussed system: preventative investment, community planning, some links to the principles of Marmot places. Places and communities: community and voluntary sector, social prescribing, climate change and nature. Enabling healthy living: physical activity. Social and economic factors: early years and child development, education, some links to community wealth building principles

Health and Social Care Service Renewal Framework – 17th June 25

Care being more people-led, with greater emphasis on choice and control. Principles include prevention, people and community. Builds on Population Health Framework and aims to maximise the contribution health and social care services can make to improve population health.

Scotland's Public Service Reform Strategy: Delivering for Scotland – 19th June 25

Promotes integrated solutions to complex issues, avoiding working in silos. There is also an emphasis towards prioritising prevention and empowering people and communities to shape the services that matter to them. Also makes direct links to Population Health Framework

Highland Outcome Improvement Plan: 2024-2027

Partnership behaviours and collaborative working principles

People outcomes around good health and social wellbeing; Place outcomes around communities being strong and resilient, and maximising opportunities from sustainable tourism culture and heritage; Prosperity outcomes around natural capital (though caution here to frame natural capital in terms of preservation and nurturing rather than exploiting).

Collaboration across services and with partners

Less specific wording links, but there are connections with Strategic Priority Outcomes of a Fair and Caring Highland with quality of life and opportunities; resilient and sustainable communities, a sustainable Highland environment.

Of the six portfolios, there are connecting opportunities in Person centred solutions within community based care solutions and community led service delivery; in Tourism and Highland visitor experience; and in some contributory opportunities within net zero aims
